Need for Training Programme:

The COVID-19 pandemic has brought forth an unprecedented upheaval before the human lives and livelihoods around the globe. The pandemic of COVID-19 has severely affected India also. The most disastrous impact is being observed on the lives and livelihoods of rural people, especially on the most vulnerable/ deprive category of people as their means of survival are not capable to cope up with the present crisis. Another issue that has placed rural areas under additional pressure is the unprecedented situation of return of migrant labourers in their home state/ District/ Village. This situation has increased the vulnerability of life and livelihood of the people, many folds not only who have returned, but also for those who have already been living in there. The only option available for these vulnerable people is the programmes/ schemes for rural development, social security and welfare. It has been brought into notice by media reports that many of the people are not covered under the public of rural employment, social security and welfare.

Keeping in mind the unpredicted situation and underlining the role of public policy especially in this pandemic, some districts have been identified, based on the number of returnee migrants, for additional intervention under Garib Kalyan Rojgar Abhiyaan launched in June 2020 to empower and provide livelihood opportunities in areas/ villages witnessing a large number of returnee migrant workers affected by the devastating COVID-19. Considering the vulnerability of life and livelihood of the people residing in these areas, it is felt that Garib Kalyan Rojgar Abhiyaan alone could not be able to minimize the risk

and threat have been facing by the people, but there is a need to bring all relevant programmes/ schemes of public policy at one platform, It is also true that intra and inter-departmental coordination is very poor and convergent planning practice is also few. The majority of the sectoral department prepare their plan in isolation with the dominance of construction works. The programme of social, health, welfare security get scanty or minimum attention, Therefore, there is a need to building a pool of officers who are well acquitted with other sectoral department policy and programmes along with their department programme.

In this process, NIRDPR can play an instrumental role by building the capacity of officers who will be acquitted with all relevant public policy and skill to prepare a vertically and horizontally integrated for effective implementation of multiple public policies. In his backdrop, a ToT is proposed.

Aims and Objectives:

The ToT aims to support the processes and activities of Govt of India being undertaken in the Garib Kalyan Rojgar Abhiyan districts worse affected sharing the nitty-gritty of the ideas, experiences and mechanism for their effective implementation.
