Need of the Seminar

In the present era of liberalisation and globalisation wherein market forces adopt a key role, it becomes essential to involve the NGO sector to lead in helping poor and enable the people to face the challenges posed by the multiple factors.

NGOs/CBOs can help the poor by providing access to the system, information on market opportunities, training facilities, information on sources of credit, etc. They are instrumental in various kinds of activities concerning to livelihoods, employment, empowerment of women & children, promotion of tribal welfare and environment etc.

However, despite their vital role, a large number of NGOs find it difficult to sustain in the long run i.e. sustainability of organizations as well as sustainability of projects.

Considering the vital role towards uplifting the socioeconomic status of the rural poor especially tribal people, a seminar is being organized to analyze further strengthening the role of CBOs and NGOs in the Emerging Rural Transformation Scenario in NE region.

Objectives of the Seminar

It is also recommended that the length of the abstract and full paper should not exceed 300 words and 6,000 words, respectively, excluding preliminary pages, annexure and references. It should be written in Times New Roman, 12 pt. and line spacing- 1.15 lines. For reference we recommend the APA style.

The abstract should include the title of the proposed paper, name of author/s, institutional affiliation (if any), email address and postal address, key words upto six and finally a paragraph of not more than 300 words summarizing the main findings and the argument of the proposed paper, and its significance.

The full paper should be arranged as follows: Title page, the presenter's name, institutional affiliation (if any), email address and postal address, Abstract, Key-words, Introduction, Methods, Findings, Discussion, Citations and references
