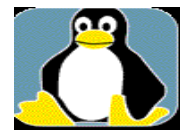

About NIRD&PR : The NIRD&PR is an apex Organization under the Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India (GoI) for training, research, action research and consultancy in rural development. The Institute serves as a forum for discussion and debate on issue of common concern, attracts academics and development practitioners from all over the country and abroad. NIRD&PR trains more than 5000 senior level administrators, planners and Rural Development functionaries every year.

Need : India is characterized by Rural Areas and is poverty stricken. In order to improve the quality of life in Rural areas and address multi-dimensional problems of people living in such areas, several Rural Development schemes is being conceived and implemented by the Ministry of Rural Development e.g. PMAY-G for Rural Housing. There is a great need to effectively manage the implementation of the scheme for ensuring that the benefits reach the targeted population. The success of any such development Programme largely depends upon adoption of appropriate strategies and optimum utilization of technological tools for effective management. Governments at national and state level are emphasizing on adoption of web based monitoring system like AWAAS Soft, in managing this Program. Application of tools and techniques of Monitoring & Evaluation and Project Management not only facilitate timely completion of projects but also ensure quality.

Public Financial Management System (PFMS) is a financial management platform developed by the office of the Controller General of Accounts, Ministry of Finance in collaboration with the Planning Commission. PFMS leverages a unique interface with the Core Banking System (CBS) of banks, to provide real-time reporting of banking transactions. All financial data captured by the system can therefore be reconciled with system authenticated transactions. The Public Financial Management System (PFMS) is a web-based application for payment, accounting and reconciliation of Government transactions and integrates various existing standalone systems. The primary objective of PFMS is to facilitate sound Public Financial Management System for Government of India (GoI) by establishing an efficient fund flow system as well as a payment cum accounting network. PFMS provides various stakeholders with a real time, reliable and meaningful management information system and an effective decision support system, as part of the Digital India initiative of Goal.

Article 243G of the Indian Constitution mandates preparation of plans for economic development and social justice by Panchayats. Fourteenth Finance Commission (FFC) has awarded a substantial grant

exclusively for the Gram Panchayats, which to be devolved over a period of five years starting from FY 2015-16. The guidelines issued by Ministry of Finance for the release and utilization of the local bodies grant stipulate that proper plans are to be prepared by the Gram Panchayats. Ministry of Panchayati Raj has also issued detailed guidelines for preparation of Gram Panchayat Development Plan (GPDP). Subsequently all States have issued their State specific guidelines and GPDPs are being prepared and uploaded in the PlanPlus (web portal developed by NIC). However process needs improvement to have good quality need-based plans. An important step in the GPDP process is the Situation Analysis for which various types of data concerning status of development in the Gram Panchayat need to be collected and analyzed to prepare a Situation Analysis Report or Development Status Report. Socio Economic Caste Census (SECC) data can be of tremendous use for this purpose. However, planning teams and resource persons providing trainings to those planning teams are not aware how to use SECC data for planning purpose. This training through lecture and demonstration will enhance the capacity of participants in extracting, analyzing and using SECC data for understanding the development status and using the same for preparing GPDP.

Objectives :

- To Orient participants on the potential of ICTs and e-Governance.
- To demonstrate IT Application in various Rural Development schemes like PMAY-G.
- To demonstrate IT Application in Financial Management through PFMS.
- To demonstrate the method of generation of Beneficiaries list for various Government schemes through SECC database.
- To demonstrate the guidelines for preparation of Gram Panchayat Development Plan (GPDP) after that uploading in the PlanPlus.
- To build up an awareness and understanding of Open Source Software, along with acquaint with the use of open source Technologies.

Broad Area of Topics : The expected outcomes of this programme is to get knowledge of the participants how to operate entire Government Development Machineries through IT. In the program it will discuss the use of AWAAS soft for implementation of PMAYG, use of PFMS for Financial Management and use of PlanPlus for GPDP, including brief idea of SECC.

Methodology : Latest teaching methods such as lecture-cum-discussions & Field Visits, live demos, and case-studies along with practice sessions on computers.
