NEED

The Government of India launched the Aspirational Districts Programme in January 2018 to accelerate improvement in key development parameters in the most backward districts of the country. This programme marks a significant shift from merely pursuing economic growth to actively reducing deep spatial inequalities. It is aligned with the Government's motto of 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas,' which echoes the principle of 'Leaving No One Behind' in the pursuit of Agenda 2030.
